

Spread the Peace grant guidelines

For he himself is our peace, who has made the two one and has destroyed the barrier, the dividing wall of hostility, by abolishing in his flesh the law with its commandments and regulations. His purpose was to create in himself one new man out of the two, thus making peace, and in this one body to reconcile both of them to God through the cross, by which he put to death their hostility. He came and preached peace to you who were far away and peace to those who were near. For through him we both have access to the Father by one Spirit.

Purpose

To encourage congregations and area conferences to “spread the peace” in and beyond the Mennonite community, the Peace and Justice Support Network of Mennonite Church USA has small start-up grants available.

Criteria

Funds will be given to those projects meeting the following criteria and as funding allows:

- To Mennonite congregations or area conferences for projects based in the United States
- For church initiatives
- For witness, reaching out, sharing the peace of Christ
- For NEW projects or a NEW initiative of a current project
- For projects beginning after November 30, 2010
- To recipients who will raise local matching funds from individual donors and other organizations, both within and outside the congregation or area conference, to demonstrate local ownership and commitment
- To recipients who have not received a grant in the last five years

Grants of up to \$1,000 are given as Peace and Justice Support Network funding allows. Our goal is to distribute \$3,000 annually.

Applications will be accepted from June 1 through September 1. Please do not submit an application before that time. Applications are due September 1, 2010. Your application should be no more than five pages (applicant information page, narrative responses to questions, and project budget).

Decisions will be made at the fall Peace and Justice Support Network meeting. Funds will be distributed in December 2010. Recipients are expected to provide a report on the project.
